**Participants:** 200 Students from 82 public schools and 56 Teachers

The event started with a video on Facebook safety and settings when using Android phones at 10:30 another video on Safer Internet Day was shown.

An opening remark by **Mrs. Olawepo** Principal Itolo Girl's Senior High School, she welcome everyone and thank the organization for the amazing work that we do, and also appreciated the partners and resource persons for taking out time to be at the event.

Followed by Keynote address from **Mr. Ojelola Rasheed** representative of Education district IV who represented **Mr J.O. Oshodi**, Director - Special Duties, Education District IV.

**Mr. Felix Iziomoh**, Founder / Executive Director – International Centre for Leadership Development Nigeria (ICLDNG) gave the welcome address started by observing all protocols, greeted everyone remind them that they all have a role to play to Create, connect and share respect; A better internet starts with everyone!

In championing a better internet, the theme aims to encourage people to embrace technology and make the most of the positive opportunities offered online, while giving them the resilience, skills, knowledge and support they need to navigate any online risks they may come across.

**Topic presented:** The role of EFCC in combating cyber criminals in Nigeria

**1<sup>st</sup> Speaker:** Mr. Murtala Ariyo- EFCC, Ikoyi Lagos

**Mr. Ariyo** spoke to the students on the consequences of engaging in Cybercrime. That as young people, they should watch the company they keep and the kind of activities they engage themselves with while online. The internet offers a lot of opportunity for young people to learn and be successful, however it also holds a lot of dangers that the students should be aware of. Some of the dangers include becoming friends with people you meet online and sharing personal information like home address, your parents banking details to these people or choosing to meet these strangers without informing your parents or any adult around you. He further warned that students should never register any SIM card for someone or give people their SIM card to use because they can be a prime suspect if the SIM is used for any crime. As he wrapped up his presentation, he encouraged students not to buy into the idea of quick money, that there are lots of young people being detained by EFCC for financial crimes because of quick money rather, they should focus on their education, build the right capacity and work hard to get what you want.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Speaker:** Mrs Treasures Uchegbu, Life Skills / Development Facilitator

**Topic:** Effective Parenting in this Digital Age

Mrs Uchegbu started her presentation with the Pros and Cons of Digital Native vs Digital Immigrant, offline considerations – Uncompromisables, she also provided the Parental E- Literacy Toolkit Contents (PET) and finally, she gave the participants key takeaways: Treat Digital media as you would other environment/developmental issue, Know when to plug off, Unplugged play time (connect) and join in – debug Co-presence Make your Own Family Media use plan/policies – Clone yours, Ongoing Parent-Schools Partnerships – Fan healthy offline relationships Understand the value of Face2Face Communication – A family that plays together, Learns together – shared respects, Lead by Example – Be the Role Model (Intentionally) Create Tech-Free Zones – Steve Job & Bill Gates, Don't use digital media as a pacifier Do your Homework on phones and apps for your children, Its Ok to have your teens online Be Proactive than reactive – Open to learning from them, Remember Children will be Children – make room for mistakes – Learning Curves, The God-Factor – Prayers Still works

**3rd Speaker:** Mr Remmy Nweke Group Executive Editor - DigitalSENSE Media Africa Group

**Topic:** Nigerian students, Technology Education and Cyber Crime

He started with the definition of Cyber Crime, that it is a crime, or computer-oriented crime, which involves a computer and a network. Provided information on Student's in the Era of Technology, Demerits of Technology in Education, Merits of Technology in Education, risks and consequences of cybercrime to Nigerian, social media techniques for students and he finally recommended that School proprietors should be grounded in the content of Nigerian Education Policy (NEP) and prepare for global competitiveness.

Students, must always exhibit positive confidence which goes with sharing only content they are sure of.

The Ministry of Youth should ASAP conduct a survey on Child Online and Abuse in Nigeria with regards to technologies.

Nigeria should establish a Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre (CEOPC) with a portal for reporting Child Online Abuses

Parental care or guide is very key to safety of children online, while they must stick to Closed User Group (CUG), so as to stay safe and share beneficial information.

Use of Apps with user content control or user setting options like Twitter, Instagram, Facebook etc is encouraged among others.

Apply discipline in the use of social media and focus on their education first.
